Diocesan Assembly

There were at least six parishioners from Glenelg parish at the Diocesan Assembly last week. It was held at the Vietnamese Catholic Centre in Pooraka (the church is worth visiting if you haven't been there). Over 350 people from around the Archdiocese participated and there was much energy and personal engagement. Principals and religious education leaders from Catholic schools were present, as well as parishioners, priests, people from Catholic agencies of Vinnies, Centacare and Caritas etc. There were presentations from diocesan leaders, engaging music (led by our fantastic Glengowrie musos!), Mass and prayer and sharing around round tables.

This was the third Diocesan Assembly we have had since 2021. At these gatherings there is a lot of informal chat as well as thinking and suggesting about how we can move ahead as church. The Assembly is part of a wider movement in the global church which is currently involved in a Synod. Pope Francis has set the theme of Synodality, meaning that we are to be a people walking together, listening to, and respecting each one. The Second Vatican Council spoke of the pilgrim church following the path which Christ trod, nourished by the sacraments, journeying towards our eternal home. To be a synodal church means we are prepared to listen to others, and sometimes that is challenging.

Bishop Shane McKinley has written about the experience during the Australian Plenary Council when a crisis arose about the role of women in the church. Various options were presented but they did not receive enough votes. Would the Council say anything on the topic of women or was it blocked because of lack of votes? Bishop McKinley explains that after this crisis people came together again. This time "people spoke much more from the heart, with a vulnerability that exposed them personally, putting themselves on the line to describe their lived experience of how they were personally affected".

He writes that this way of speaking from the heart enabled a new type of listening to emerge. There was greater mutual understanding, and a better way developed of walking together.

In our families, and in our parish we too are called to be more synodal. Listening is not always easy, especially when there are conflicting opinions. In those times we might need to keep coming back and trying again. Speaking from the heart and from our own experience might be a key in moving towards greater mutual understanding and walking together.
