## “Your Faith Has Saved You”

A lecturer asked his students to explain their understanding of faith. A silence followed and eventually some students endeavoured to articulate their thoughts. Suffice to say that there wasn't much consistency in their responses. I am not being critical; I was one of the students! What it does highlight for me is that faith is something of a mystery. And yet faith is at the very heart of being a Christian.

How often in the Gospels do we hear Jesus say to a person, “Your faith has saved you”? e.g. (Luke 7:50). Faith is the central theme of today's readings. In the first reading, the prophet Ezekiel is sent by God to rebellious Israelites. This may well be a dangerous mission as the rebels could turn on him. It would take great faith for Ezekiel to accept God's order. In the Gospel, Jesus is rejected by the people of his hometown. We are told that Jesus was amazed, and no doubt greatly disappointed at their lack of faith. As a consequence, he was unable to exercise his healing powers. It seems faith is integral in Christian discipleship. We can turn to the Scriptures for powerful examples of faith in action. In the Hebrew Scriptures, we hear the story of Joseph and his brothers (Genesis). Joseph is the favoured son of his father, Jacob. His brothers are intensely jealous of him and they sell him into slavery and he is taken to Egypt. Over time, Joseph rises to positions of great power, finally second only to the Pharaoh. A great famine is experienced and Joseph's brothers travel to Egypt to buy corn. There they encounter Joseph but do not recognise him. Eventually they discover it is Joseph, a man of great power. They are in fear that he will extract retribution from them. They go to Joseph and throw themselves at his feet crying for his forgiveness and mercy.

Joseph's response is one of the great declarations of faith in Scripture: **“But Joseph said to them, ‘Don't be afraid. Am I in the place of God? You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives. So then, don't be afraid. I will provide for you and your children’. And he reassured them and spoke kindly to them.” (Gen 50:19-21).**

Joseph trusted that even in evil (being sold into slavery) God would work to bring good. Another example is given in today's second reading. St Paul tells the Corinthians that in his weakness (his ill-health) he is strong through the power of God working in and through him. We all experience evil and suffering. Trusting that God will work through our setbacks and problems is, I believe, the heart of faith.
