Pilgrims of Hope. That is the theme of Jubilee 2025 which begins in December. We might recognise a need for greater hope in our lives. At times we face problems which don't seem to go away and we can feel we are facing a relentless pace of life. As well, in the background there is worry about global conflict. It might be time to reset and find our foundations again. That is the purpose of the Jubilee which will commence on 24 December in St Peter's Basilica in Rome.

A Jubilee in biblical times was a time of renewal and making things right. The word Jubilee comes from the *yobel*, the ram's horn which was used to proclaim the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur). This Jewish feast day is celebrated each year and has its history in the celebration of the 50th year. It is a time to re-establish relationship with God, with one another, with all creation, a time to forgive debts, return stolen goods, and give the land a period of fallow. In our Catholic tradition we have celebrated a Jubilee every 25 years beginning from the year 1300. It is a time in which God's mercy and forgiveness are taken on board in a new way, reparation is made and hope of forgiveness is strengthened. A special "indulgence" is offered from the treasury of God's grace by way of spiritual acts indicated by the pope.

Last Tuesday some of us had a time of prayer together after the 9.30am Mass. In the context of adoration we prayed the rosary, listened to a couple of readings and hymns and prayed a Litany of Divine Mercy. After the prayer we gathered for morning tea and shared our experiences. There was much life in the sharing. We will celebrate another time of prayer and sharing after 9.30am Mass on Tuesday 30 July.

A major theme of the Jubilee is hope. "In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring", writes Pope Francis. "Hope does not disappoint, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us" (*Rom 5:5*). Another theme is pilgrimage. A pilgrimage is a journey with a sacred destination, reminding us of our life's journey towards God and our heavenly home. The Holy Door which will be opened in St Peter's Basilica to remind us that Jesus is the door who opens us to life with the Father, "I am the door" (John 10:17).

The logo at the top of this page shows pilgrims walking together on the unsettled sea of life towards the Cross of Christ which is an anchor of hope.
