Vocation - Baptism Identity John Herd PP

Over the next week we are asked to reflect on and pray for vocations. What do we mean by vocation? How do we understand vocation today? Vocation refers to a calling from God, a divine summons. The first call we have from God is to affirm the gift of life we have received and to do what we can to develop ourselves, to grow towards the human potential we have. We can recognise our particular interests and talents, for example with sport or with study or with gardening or with communicating with others. No doubt God calls us forward by means of the various gifts and desires we have. So, the first step in a vocation, it seems to me, is to be aware of the particular ways I have been gifted, and to receive from God the gift of myself with thanksgiving. Do I appreciate that I have been made in the image of God, a temple of the Holy Spirit? Do I recognise that God continues to accompany me in my life and looks on me with love? A vocation is born, I think, from the awareness of God's goodness to me, and that God will be faithful.

A major development at Vatican II is the understanding of church as communion. The Holy Trinity is the perfect communion of Persons and we are called build our relationships in their likeness. Jesus prayed at the Last Supper, "Father, may they be one as you and I are one". Rather than an individualistic understanding of our faith, we called to belong to the communion of believers. The current emphasis on Synodality is taking up this emphasis and calling us to be the pilgrim people of God, walking with each other and building communion.

From this understanding of church as communion, Vatican II affirms the identity and vocation of the lay faithful. Rather than just priests and religious having a vocation, Vatican II stated clearly that there is a "universal call to holiness". The document *Lumen Gentium* points out that the Lord Jesus called all his disciples to be "perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Mt 5:48).

Through Baptism we are justified and we become sons and daughters of God and sharers in divine nature. This means that in the gift of Baptism we are made holy and are called to preserve and develop holiness. This common call to holiness includes the struggle with temptation, sin and evil. We are to receive mercy from the heart of God and to grow in kindness, meekness, humility and patience. We all have a common call to know Christ more deeply and to grow in likeness of Him. The vocation of all of us in the church flows from Baptism. We have a marvellous array of how we live out the vocation of Baptism in unique ways.
