**Prayer for Vocations**

Last week we focused on the vocation of all of us, the faithful. In Baptism we all receive a call from God to holiness and to love. This week we focus on the vocation to ministry within the church. In Luke 10 we hear how the Lord sends out 72 missionaries to go ahead of him to the towns he is to enter. They are to offer peace to the houses they visit, heal the sick and say to people that the Kingdom of God has come close. Jesus says, “The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to do his harvesting” (Lk 10:2).

First let’s give thanks for the vocations we have. In our Archdiocese we have a few priests ordained in the last few years, and few older ones, including me, who have been on the road for a while. We have a number of international priests from India and Africa who generously come here as missionaries. We have some retired priests, including Fr Bob Wilkinson and Fr Anthony Kain who ministered in this parish. Since the Vatican Council we also have new ministries such as the permanent diaconate, and we are grateful for retired Deacon Pat Edwards who ministered in our parish for many years.

Since the Vatican Council we have seen liturgical ministry expand to include lay people, including women, who are called as acolytes, extraordinary ministers, lectors, or readers at Mass. You may remember in the pre-Conciliar church women were not permitted on the sanctuary. In pastoral care lay people, including women, are called as pastoral associates and also as catechists. We have lay people who lead various parish programs such as RCIA, Alpha and visitation to the sick. The priest today needs to welcome and encourage lay people to the various ministries within the liturgy and for pastoral care in parish.

Some people were hoping that the Synod in October would discuss calling of women as deacons. But that is not a topic for discussion and the official church position is that priesthood and diaconate are reserved to men only. There is an understanding of complementarity, that the priest represents Christ the Bridegroom who serves the church, his Bride. We certainly need to acknowledge with gratitude the contribution of so many women, especially religious women who have given so much, including in our parish. A few days ago we celebrated the solemnity of St Mary Mackillop and recognise her extraordinary life which still reverberates today.

Ministry within the church has changed over time and maybe we sense it is not quite settled. As we pray for vocations this weekend, we can also pray that the Synod will be open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit. We should pray also for our two seminarians who are studying at Holy Spirit Seminary in Brisbane.
