

Truth and Peace: A Gospel Word in a Violent World John Herd PP

The world we live in has been growing in violence. The shocking unjust war in Ukraine, the terrible suffering of innocent people in Gaza are signs of a world spiralling into more violence. The need for cease-fire is clear and yet it doesn't happen. There is danger of escalation. As is often said, war is a defeat for humanity. It should be possible for leaders to sit down and resolve conflict through dialogue, negotiation and compromise. But on the world scale this has become hard to achieve. As well as globally, we can be aware of growing violence and social fragmentation in our own society. The problem of growing lack of peace is apparent in our own communities.

This year's social justice statement from the Australian Bishops takes up the theme of building peace. The statement makes the claim that peace needs to be built on truth. The statement outlines a history of an erosion of truth in public life. While competing claims to truth have always been part of public life there are new phenomena today: social media is a vehicle able to rapidly spread lies and conspiracy theories, social media allows misinformation and covert ideologies to be readily accepted; absence of generally accepted authorities and lack of responsible self-regulations by media companies; collection of data on social media which provides means to manipulate rather than educate people; a generalised atmosphere of mistrust which allows for charismatic leaders to offer simplistic solutions often blaming minority groups for social problems.

The social justice statement argues that truth is the essential foundation of peace. As Catholics we are called to live by Gospel values which recognises the dignity of each person, even those with whom we disagree. Pope Francis' teaching includes the importance of promoting a culture of dialogue and encounter based on the teachings of Jesus Christ who is the ultimate source of truth and peace.

The statement offers some practical actions we can take to build a culture of peace based on truth. For example, we can choose paths of peace within our own lives; in prayer regularly ask for God's gift of peace; in conversations try to do more listening than talking; rather than engage people on the internet try to meet others in person and welcome the encounter; join groups which foster belonging and welcome.
