Jubilee Year - Sacred Liturgy

One way to renew our faith in this Jubilee Year is to re-visit the main documents of the Second Vatican Council. Pope Saint John XXIII called the Second Vatican Council to bring the church up to date (aggiornamento is the Italian word used). Vatican II was the twenty-first ecumenical council and met in four sessions from 1962-65. The four main documents of Vatican II are the constitutions on the Sacred Liturgy, the Church, Divine Revelation and the Church in the Modern World. I propose over the next few weeks to give some of the main points of these documents and encourage us to live the vision of Vatican II more fruitfully.

The constitution on the liturgy was the first of the documents agreed at Vatican II, and it had almost immediate effect. You may remember that the language of the Mass changed from Latin to English. A key principle which the bishops operated from was a desire "that all the faithful should be led to that full, conscious, and active participation in the liturgy which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy itself" (SC, 14). Many people did not understand Latin and so could not understand the prayers or dialogue at Mass. This meant that most lay people followed along without understanding, sometimes praying the rosary. Vatican II wanted all the faithful, lay people, priests and religious, to be actively and consciously and fully involved in the liturgy.

Lay people were encouraged to take up active ministry in the liturgy. Prior to Vatican II, the priest was almost the sole minister, with an altar server to assist and sometimes a lector to read. Women were not allowed on the sanctuary. Vatican II says that liturgical services are actions of the whole church and everyone who has an office to perform should do all but only those parts which pertain to that office. "Servers, lectors commentators, and members of the choir also exercise a genuine liturgical function. They ought, therefore, to discharge their office with the sincere piety and decorum demanded by so exalted a ministry and rightly expected of them by God's people" (SC, 29).

There was an awareness of the presence of Christ in various ways. We read that Christ is present in the sacrifice of the Mass "not only in his minister but especially under the Eucharistic species. He is present in His word, since it is He Himself who speaks when the holy scriptures are read in the Church. He is present, lastly, when the Church prays and sings" (SC, 7). Vatican II encouraged the use of scripture: "The treasures of the bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God's word" (SC, 51). There is no further room to discuss other developments but we can see that the changes brought about in the liturgy have increased our active participation and brought us deeper into union with God and each other.

At his Wednesday audience the Pope recalled how Joseph's role in the fulfilment of God's saving plan was made known to him in a dream, and how, despite some initial doubts, he, with great faith and trust, responds by taking Mary as his wife and making a home for the incarnate Son of God. As Joseph sleeps, the Pope recalled that he hears the words: 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home.' Faced with this revelation, the Holy Father recalled that Joseph does not ask for further proof.

Rather, he trusts in God and accepts God's dream for his life and that of his betrothed. "He thus," the Pope marvelled, "enters into the grace of one who knows how to live the divine promise with faith, hope and love."
