

Preparation for Easter

Our four catechumens, Henry, Olivia, Lachlan and Hans, celebrated the rite of election with Archbishop Pat last Sunday in our cathedral. This Sunday they will have the first of three scrutinies as they prepare for the Easter sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. The word scrutiny sounds a bit funny but it means being examined and strengthened. They are examined about their intention of purpose, do they really desire to be claimed by Christ and follow his way? We all know the mystery of sin within our hearts which keeps us from responding with openness to Christ. The prayer of strengthening is for all of us. Part of the prayer to be used goes like this: "free them from the slavery of sin, and for Satan's cunning voke exchange the gentle voke of Jesus. Protect them from every danger, that they may serve you faithfully in peace and joy and render you thanks for ever."

As Christ's faithful here in Glenelg we are asked to journey with the elect as they prepare for Baptism. We too can give some time to self-searching and, with prayer, seek repentance. Our desire can be for Christ in all his beauty to live in our hearts. The readings this Sunday warn us not to blame God for the evil and hostility in our lives. God is not vindictive and does not send disasters to punish people. Pope Francis says that it is 'our selfishness that tears apart relationships; ... our wrong and violent choices that unleash evil.' We are called to acknowledge the truth that the darkness of sin lurks in our hearts and, like the elect preparing for Baptism, we too in Lent can profitably seek to be strengthened in Christ who is the way, the truth and the life.

Pope Francis has been seriously sick with severe respiratory infection for five weeks. During that time he has sent messages expressing his closeness with all who live with sickness; he expressed his thanks for those who are caring for him and all who care for the sick. He wrote a letter to a newspaper in response to a question about world conflict. He wrote that war seems even more absurd from his bed of sickness; "war only devastates communities and the environment, without offering solutions to conflicts; diplomacy and international organizations need new blood and credibility. Moreover, religions can inspire spirituality within peoples to revive the desire for brotherhood and justice, the hope for peace."

As we continue our journey towards Easter, we can become conscious of our call to build peace. We are building peace as we unite against poverty in our support of Project Compassion. We promoting peace as we use words with more reflection to build up others and seek consensus. We are seeking peace as we come close to those who are sick and housebound.

Homeshare: A solution to the rental crisis for older women in SA

Homelessness among older women in Australia is increasing, making them one of the fastest-growing groups at risk of housing insecurity. The *Homeshare* program offers an innovative solution that fosters shared living based on mutual support and reciprocity – a model that has been successfully running around the world for years.

A partnership between St Vincent de Paul Society SA, Westside Housing and Shelter SA, the <u>Homeshare Pilot</u> <u>Program</u> is a fee free service that carefully matches female householders aged 55+ living on their own that have a spare bedroom, with female home sharers that need affordable accommodation from a similar age group that can offer some help around the house. Unlike a traditional flatmate arrangement, the matching process is rigorous: both parties undergo interviews, reference checks and police clearances to ensure a safe and reliable match.
