Some Thoughts on The Moral Life

A few years ago someone asked me what is a contemporary understanding of sin. I remember thinking that is a good question. It implies that there is an old and possibly outmoded understanding of sin. During the week we had a meeting with the RCIA group, that is, the ‘elect’ who are now preparing to enter the church at the Easter vigil. We looked at the topic of the moral life. What does the church teach about morality? How can we understand sin today? These are big questions but here I want to make a few broad points.

First, the way morality was presented in the past largely focused on avoiding sin. Many may remember the teaching about missing Mass on Sunday, about fasting from meat on Fridays, about the dangers of sexuality. A major question was whether some act constituted mortal sin. The Second Vatican Council gave a direction that moral teaching should be guided more by scripture. In scripture we recognise the direction of growing in discipleship – we are always on the way of becoming the person God wants us to be. And, while sin is real and causes alienation with God, it is understood in the context of the healing power of Christ who calls us out of darkness into his own wonderful light. The Bible shows God’s readiness to forgive for those who seek his mercy. This means we can see our past sins without fear as part of the rich tapestry of our lives in relationship with the Saviour who keeps calling us to become more.

Second, the church teaches that we do not create moral laws ourselves, rather the truth about what is good is revealed to us by God. Moral laws point to the good which is to be protected, promoted and nourished (At Home, 188). St John Paul II says that our freedom is extensive but not unlimited, and the image of the tree of good and evil in Genesis 2 reminds us of our limits. Rather than creating our own moral laws, we discover the truth about what is good. We need to take care to form our conscience, and as Christian faithful we are to be attentive to the teaching of the church, “for the church, by the will of Christ is the teacher of truth” (DH, 14). While we are obliged to follow our conscience we need to seek to understand what is the good that church teaching seeks to protect and promote.

Third, we can see that the moral life calls us to engage in a continual conversion to what is true and good. To repeatedly choose what is true and good, to make habits of goodness leads to virtue, or strengths of character. Virtues are those inner strengths which help us choose what is good. St Thomas spoke of charity as the “mother” of all virtues. Charity, which is the love of God in our lives, draws us forward to say ‘yes’ to God, to love one’s neighbour and oneself and leads us to all the virtues. The virtues of faith and hope and all the virtues are born from charity, which is “the love of God poured into our hearts” (Rom 5:5).

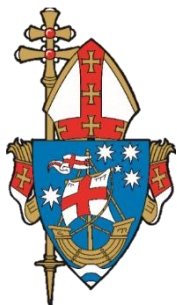

Homelessness among older women in Australia is increasing, making them one of the fastest-growing groups at risk of housing insecurity. The *Homeshare* program offers an innovative solution that fosters shared living based on mutual support and reciprocity – a model that has been successfully running around the world for years. A partnership between St Vincent de Paul Society SA, Westside Housing and Shelter SA, the [Homeshare Pilot Program](#) is a fee free service that carefully matches female householders aged 55+ living on their own that have a spare bedroom, with female home sharers that need affordable accommodation from a similar age group that can offer some help around the house. Unlike a traditional flatmate arrangement, the matching process is rigorous: both parties undergo interviews, reference checks and police clearances to ensure a safe and reliable match.
