## Called to Hope

This Sunday readings will be taken from Year A. There are three years in the cycle of Sunday readings (lectionary) and we are in Year C, but because we have catechumens who are heading towards Baptism at Easter, we have the option to choose readings from Year A. In recent weeks we have heard important encounters from John's Gospel, moments of encounter with Jesus who calls us to grow in faith. The woman of Samaria meets Jesus at the well and after dialogue with him she discovers he is a prophet who knows her story, and then more deeply she discovers he is the Christ sent by God. The man born blind cannot find his way and through Jesus' healing he receives sight; despite opposition and ridicule he is firm in his conviction and chooses to remain in the light. This Sunday we have the encounter of Jesus who raises his friend Lazarus to life.

Brendan Byrne SJ is an Australian scripture scholar with a doctorate from Oxford and extensive teaching and research about the Letter to Romans and the four Gospels. Brendan writes that the raising of Lazarus in John's Gospel is the climax of Jesus' public ministry and is really "the last straw for the authorities and leads immediately into the plot to arrest him and bring about his death". Jesus hears the news of the illness and death of his friend Lazarus while he is in safe territory across the Jordan. He waits two days and then says to the disciples, "Let us go to Judea"; to which they reply that not long before at that place the authorities had wanted to stone him. In other words, Jesus deliberately moves from a place of personal security and safety to a place of danger because of his friend Lazarus. Jesus goes to give life to his friend and in the process puts his life in mortal danger. The Gospel message here, Brendan tells us, is that Jesus enters into his passion because of his love for Lazarus, and the same for us, Jesus enters into mortal danger because of his love for me.

A significant aspect in this encounter is the way the two sisters speak with Jesus. They are his friends and they welcome him. They are women of faith, with Martha proclaiming, "Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into the world". But there is also the human expression of sadness and grief: "If you had been here, my brother would not have died..." And Mary says the same thing. Is it a mild rebuke to Jesus? It is significant that Jesus shares their pain of grief as we hear that he was in great distress and gave a sigh straight from the heart; and especially, "He wept". Is this a message for those of us who suffer the loss of a loved one? Yes, we believe in Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life, but he also accompanies us in our human pain and loss. We are called to move towards Holy Week with great hope.

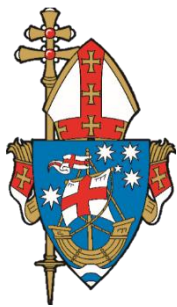

### For the 5<sup>th</sup> week of Lent, we focus on the transformative work of Caritas Australia and the importance of Project Compassion to our work.

\*Start letting your community know how they can return their Project Compassion boxes/envelopes. Can the envelopes be put on 2<sup>nd</sup> collection plate? (Make sure your Counters know what to do with them). Do you have a container for the returned boxes? Can they be taken up each week as part of the Offertory Procession?

\*Timely reminders help e.g. before your next weekend Mass – not just at Mass. Busy lives, easily forget, but a reminder helps get the envelope or box near the front door ready to return.

This week Caritas staff had a lunchtime talk from a staff member reporting on programs in remote Indonesia. We, in Adelaide, are experiencing quite a long dry spell but this part of Indonesia can sometimes face 8 months without good rain. Their wells run dry and it costs \$50 to buy water for a 5000lt tank. This is a significant chunk of earnings. A flush of a toilet can use 9lt ... think how long 5000lt would last you? I hope this one small example can help motivate you and your team to help promote Project Compassion. My sincere thanks.

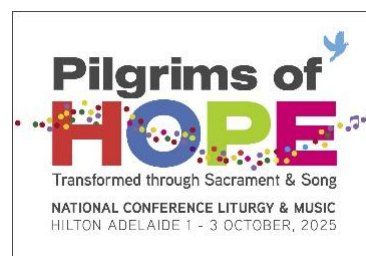
