

"<u>The Mystery of Faith</u>" Deacon Pat Edwards

I am presently listening to an audio book titled 'Conclave' written by Robert Harris. The book has been made into a film which may still be showing at some cinemas. The narrative tells the story of the election of a new Pope following the death of the ruling Pontiff. The variety of the personalities of the Cardinals, their differing factions and their ambitions for the Church and themselves so often bring.drama to the story. There is one particular incident in the film I would like to share with you.

A Mass is celebrated in St Peter's Basilica on the eve of the conclave. It is attended by all of the Cardinals and great numbers of laity and clergy. The principal celebrant is to be the Dean of the College of Cardinals. He will preach the homily intended to provide the voting Cardinals with matters for reflection on their important task. The Dean is understandably daunted by the commission he has been given. The moment arrives for him to preach. He takes his prepared homily to the lectern and commences to speak but after one page he suddenly pauses and puts his prepared homily aside. He then continues saying he wants to speak from the heart. He draws on the second reading, taken from St Paul's letter to the Ephesians. The text details St Paul's image of the Body of Christ, a diverse group of followers of race, skills and personalities. Unity in diversity held together by service. This is a powerful metaphor for a diverse people in a unified body with Christ as its head. The Dean goes on to say that, in his long service of the Church, the sin he most fears is that of certainty. Certainty, he asserts is the enemy of unity. Certainty is the deadly enemy of tolerance and without tolerance the Church cannot grow. Even Jesus cried out his uncertainty on the cross, "My God, My God why have you forsaken me?" (Matt27:46). The Dean goes on. Our faith is a living thing, precisely because it walks hand in hand with doubt. If there was only certainty and there was no doubt, there would be no mystery and therefore no need for faith.

The Dean's words do not necessarily fully reflect my own thinking, but I put them forward as a stimulus for prayerful reflection as we enter Holy Week and prepare to celebrate the Easter Mystery of our Faith," Christ has died, Christ is Risen, Christ will come again".
