Pope Francis RIP

With sadness we say farewell to pope Francis. Although we never saw him in the flesh, he has been a constant presence in the lives of so many of us. We saw him reach out with compassion and tenderness to those in need, he exuded a joy and warmth which was infectious. He led our church at a time when the crimes and scourge of sexual abuse were well known, and he gave clear direction about pursuing justice for both victims and abusers. He was an abiding presence on the world stage in times of crisis of the Covid pandemic and international conflict. So, we say farewell to Francis with gratitude and sadness.

His most significant contribution was probably his emphasis on the mercy of God. *"God's mercy is our liberation and our happiness. We live for mercy, and we cannot afford to be without mercy. It is the air that we breathe. We are too poor to set any conditions. We need to forgive, because we need to be forgiven."* Francis did not change the teaching of the Catholic Church but he gave it a new perspective, from the eyes of mercy. Not long after he became pope he recalled meeting an elderly deeply spiritual lady in Buenos Aires who said to him, "the Lord forgives all things ... if the Lord does not forgive everything the world would not exist." Francis wanted the church to bend down and humbly accompany all who know the burden of sin because we all do.

In the year he was elected pope he wrote *The Joy of the Gospel* which begins: *"The joy of the gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus. Those who accept his offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness. With Christ joy is constantly born anew. In this Exhortation I wish to encourage the Christian faithful to embark upon a new chapter of evangelization marked by this joy, while pointing out new paths for the Church's journey in years to come."* Francis did point new paths of the church. We recall him saying about gay people, *"who am I to judge?"* and insisting that the church is open and welcoming for everyone. In 2015 he began a Year of Mercy and sent out Missionaries of Mercy so many might encounter the depth of divine mercy and healing.

Francis opened new pathways by establishing a Sunday of the Poor and welcoming the poor of Rome to Mass at St Paters and to lunch with him. He opened a hostel for the homeless in a Vatican building and initiated showers and a health clinic. He went to the island of Lampedusa near where many refugees drowned and celebrated Mass and was a constant advocate for refugees and migrants. Francis began the Word of God Sunday and encouraged us all to encounter God's mercy in the scripture. We give thanks for Pope Francis and pray his generous and compassionate soul may rest in peace in God his saviour and with the Blessed Mother.

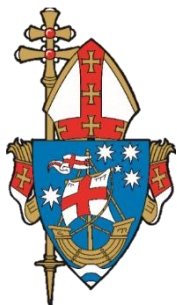
