The Ascension of the Lord

Sacred Heart of Jesus

In June we have a focus on the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We recall the apparitions to Sister Margaret Mary in Paray-Le-Monial in central France. Margaret's childhood was marked by her sickness and a painful family situation.: "The heaviest of my crosses was that I could do nothing to lighten the cross my mother was suffering." After considering marriage for some time, Margaret Mary entered the Order of the Visitation nuns at the age of 24. Margaret lived a life which was simple, frank and humble. In 1674 she received the first revelation in which she felt "invested" with the presence of God though she was afraid of deceiving herself. The request was that his love for humankind be known through her. By her own love Margaret was to make up for the coldness and ingratitude of the world, by frequent Holy Communion, especially on the first Friday, an hour of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament on Thursday to commemorate the agony and isolation in Gethsemane and spread devotion to the Sacred Heart.

In October last year Pope Francis wrote an encyclical on the human and divine love of the heart of Jesus Christ. It is called ***Dilexit Nos***, which is Latin for ***He Loved Us*** taken from Romans 8:37. We hear in John's Gospel Jesus say, "I have loved you" and "I call you friends" (Jn 15). Francis asks whether the symbol of the heart is still relevant today. He says that we live in an age of superficiality, "ending up as insatiable consumers and slaves to the mechanisms of a market unconcerned about the deeper meaning of our lives, all of us need to rediscover the importance of the heart" (DN, 2).

The heart for Francis is the "deep core of our humanity". It is in the heart that each person creates a synthesis, a unity of our being, which is the source of a person's strengths, convictions, passions and decisions. Our society does not value patience which is necessary to develop an interior life aware of the centre of our being. "It could be said, then, that I am my heart, for my heart is what sets me apart, shapes my spiritual identity and puts me in communion with other people" (DN, 14). "The word 'heart' evokes the inmost core of our person, and thus it enables us to understand ourselves in our integrity and not merely under one isolated aspect" (DN, 15).

For Francis, the heart is more than the emotions, it is the centre of our being in which our powers of memory, understanding, and decision reside. "The heart is also capable of unifying and harmonizing our personal history, which may seem hopelessly fragmented, yet is the place where everything can make sense. The Gospel tells us this in speaking of Our Lady, who saw things with the heart." (DN, 19). We too can take time to ponder the movements of the heart and seek healing for our fragmented and hurt hearts. May the Sacred Heart help us.

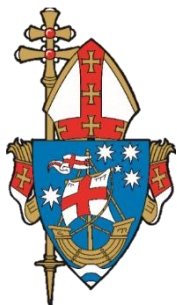

As previously communicated, the Archdiocese has established banking services with the Commonwealth Bank (CBA). All parishes have been provided with details of these banking arrangements and most parishes are doing their banking at a CBA branch, or an Australia Post office branch using CBA deposit books. Recently, we have had some instances where the correct agent number is not being used for deposits at CBA branches. 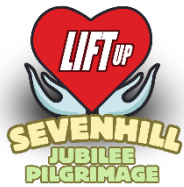
