May is a month of honouring Mary, the mother of God and mother of the church. We honour her because of her faith. Mary could not see how God's promise to her would be fulfilled and she went through times of darkness. But through her whole earthly journey Mary was open to God and willing to do what was asked of her. Even though she had questions in her heart she responded clearly and decisively to God's call given by the angel. She replied, "I am the handmaid of the Lord, let what you have said be done to me". At Cana in Galilee she saw the need of the young couple and asked her son to help them. During Jesus' journey of public ministry, Mary accompanied him, listened to him and was his first disciple. At the foot of the Cross Mary stood there bravely and in sorrow, and heard him referring to the disciple next to her and say, "This is your son". Although it is not written in the Gospels. Mary would have encountered her Risen Son with overflowing joy and gratitude. In this Easter season,, the church prays the prayer Regina Coeli — Queen of Heaven.

Let us pray. O God, who gave joy to the world through the resurrection of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech You, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

This Sunday is the 76th Marian Procession in the Archdiocese of Adelaide. No doubt the Marian Procession began a few years after the end of World War 2 as a way of thanksgiving for peace after such a terrible loss of life and immense human suffering. Surely it was also a plea for Mary to help with the quest for peace in our world. It is appropriate at this time when the world again is on the brink of world war to implore Our Lady, Queen of Heaven, to pray for us. Maybe you cannot attend the Procession physically, but we might be able to pray the Rosary and ask for her powerful prayer. Jesus gave Mary to the disciple at the foot of the Cross as mother; may we welcome our heavenly mother and ask her to help with the pursuit of peace.

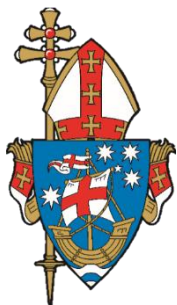
