## Laudato Si Week

Do you remember debates some years ago about the evidence for climate change? Some people were saying that climate change is scientifically established and that we need to make significant changes to reduce carbon emissions in our collective lifestyle for the good of our planet and the future of humanity. Others were saying that the scientific evidence is not clear because some scientists have written papers to show that climate change is not so serious. There was criticism for “greenies”. I recall a similar dynamic within the church. Some theologians and Catholic academics were saying this was a moral issue and the church needed to respond. Other church leaders said care for the earth was not a moral issue and the church should not stray into scientific areas but simply teach moral truths. I presume they were thinking that moral issues concerned sexuality, family, life issues, and hopefully responsibility to care for the poor.

In 2001 Pope John Paul II spoke of a need for an ecological conversion. He said that human beings had in our time “without hesitation devastated wooded plains and valleys, polluted waters, disfigured the earth's habitat, made the air unbreathable, disturbed the hydrogeological and atmospheric systems, turned luxuriant areas into deserts and undertaken forms of unrestrained industrialization, degrading that ‘flowerbed’ ... which is the earth” (17.01.2001).

In 2015 Pope Francis wrote an encyclical letter called *Laudato Si*, these words taken from the canticle of creation from St Francis of Assisi – Praise to you! This letter accepts the scientific data which shows the serious degradation of our planet and reiterates the call for an ecological conversion. He linked the cry of the earth with the cry of the poor. Often it is the poor of our world who suffer the most from climate change.

Pope Francis writes: “Authentic human development has a moral character. It presumes full respect for the human person, but it must also be concerned for the world around us and ‘take into account the nature of each being and of its mutual connection in an ordered system’. Accordingly, our human ability to transform reality must proceed in line with God’s original gift of all that is” (LS, 5). That is, morality is concerned with the world around us as well as human development in accordance with God’s plan.

There is a wonderful film about *Laudato Si* called ***Listen***. I intend to show the film in the parish with a view to becoming more informed about *Laudato Si*. I hope that as a parish we can take some concrete steps in the path of ecological conversion for sake of our planet, and for the sake of our grandchildren and their grandchildren. To celebrate the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of *Laudato Si* you are invited to a free showing of ***Listen*** on Friday 13 June at 7.30pm in St Mary’s Hall.


