The Most Holy Trinity

Three Persons, One God

The doctrine of the Holy Trinity developed in the early centuries of the church's life. The Sacred Scriptures do not explicitly refer to God as the Holy Trinity but we see in them clear indications that God is one and, at the same time, three. The Old Testament shows hints of God as Three Persons. In the book of Genesis we read that the Spirit of God hovered over the waters in anticipation of creating order out of chaos (Gen 1:1-2). In Genesis 1:26 God (the Father) seems to be speaking to someone, "Let us make mankind in our image, according to our likeness ...". In Daniel 7 there is a vision of "one like a son of man .. to him was given dominion and glory and kingship ...". In the New Testament the event of the Baptism of the Lord presents an image of the Trinity: the Father in the heavenly voice, the Son in the waters of the Jordan, the Holy Spirit as the dove (Matt 3, Mk 1, Lk 3). Jesus often refers to himself as the son of man (Mt 16:13, cf Dan 7), who has come to do the will of the Father (Jn 6:36; Mt 26:39). In 2 Corinthians we hear St Paul's blessing: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you".

But the early Jewish Christians needed to explain how they worshipped only one God while also worshipping the Lord Jesus. One problem to overcome was the philosophical idea that God is perfect and does not change. Another was that Jesus as the Messiah was not blessed with victory and worldly power but suffered and died. How could it be possible for God to change, to suffer and die? Some answered that Jesus was not really divine, rather he was human and adopted by God the Father (adoptionism and Arianism); others replied that Jesus was truly divine and only appeared to be human and only appeared to suffer and die (Docetism, Gnosticism). These heresies or wrong teachings helped the Church clarify Catholic teaching as defined in the Nicene Creed (325AD, and Chalcedon 451AD). The Nicene Creed affirms God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, Three persons equal in divinity and majesty and perfect in unity.

A major theme of the Second Vatican Council (1962-65) was *communion*. The church is understood as being a people made one in the image of the perfect unity of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit (LG, 4). The communion of the church shares in the perfect communion of the Three Divine Persons who give themselves in mutual and self-giving love. The family is a beautiful and powerful image of the Holy Trinity – husband and wife who give themselves fully to each other and overflow with the gift of a child. We build up communion in our families, in our parish and our church with kindness, tenderness and generosity. In the Most Holy Trinity we recognise perfect love which fully welcomes the difference and uniqueness of the other. We are called to imitate.
